

Steps in Responding to an Opioid Overdose

Step 1 Call for help by dialing 911

Step 2

Check for signs of an opioid overdose (see Signs of Opioid Overdose)

Step 3

Support the person's breathing by making sure the their airway is clear and administering CPR if trained

Step 4

**Administer naloxone** 

Step 5

Roll person on to their side to minimize the chance of them aspirating or choking if they vomit

Step 6

Monitor the person's response until emergency medical services arrive
